

For future monthly meetings, we will try to have name tags available so we can learn everyone's name better.


Please do not hesitate to introduce yourself to anyone you do not know. We are all friends we haven't met yet.


Buckets Still Available

This summer the George S. Eccles Dinosaur Park will get even wilder: Spinosaurus aegypticus will join our menagerie of over 50 prehistoric animal sculptures. This huge new exhibit will open on July 1st during a special event featuring new activities and special guests.

The fun continues throughout the summer with new exhibits and experiments at the Science Education Center, science demos throughout the park, and the Summer Lecture Series each Saturday at 1:00 and 3:00. This series of interactive presentations delves into a new topic each week. Two of the lectures address topics of interest to enthusiasts: this year we will tackle the science of classifying and identifying prehistoric organisms, as well as exploring how scientists calculate the age of fossils. 
