UPCOMING TRIP INFORMATION

BLUE FOREST, WYOMING - PETRIFIED WOOD

September 28th 2024





The Club will be conducting a field trip on Saturday, September 28th, to collect petrified wood northeast of Kemmerer, Wyoming. Driving time from Ogden to the collecting area is approximately three (3) hours via I-80 to highway 189 north to Kemmerer, Wyoming. *Please note: Don't forget to refuel in Kemmerer.* Continue north from Kemmerer on highway 189 until you reach highway 372, then turn east (right) on highway 372 towards **Slate Creek Campground** which is just south of Fontenelle Reservoir. Continue on highway 372 until you come to a stop sign at the intersection of highway 372 and 311, continue straight thru the stop sign on route 311 for one (1) mile to Slate Creek Campground which will be on your left. The group will meet at the Campground at 10:30 AM and we will depart for the collection site **NO LATER THAN (NLT)** 11:00 AM. Small pieces of wood can still be found on the surface, but you may want to bring a shovel and/or a ground probe to find those buried pieces of wood.

NEW MEXICO FIELD TRIP

October 10 – 14th, Columbus Day Weekend

The Club will be conducting our year end field trip beginning Thursday, October 10th – 14th to Farmington, New Mexico, with Thursday and Monday being travel days. The San Juan County Gem Club is hosting this field trip and will be taking us to the collection sites each day. Some of the things that we might be collecting; petrified wood, which includes conifers, palm, opalized and limb casts, agate, barite, quartz, fluorite and various fish fossils.

Farmington is approximately a 7 ½ to 8 hours' drive from Ogden. To get there, make your way south thru Moab to Monticello, Utah where you will turn left (east) on US Highway 491 to Cortez, Colorado and then continue south to Shiprock, New Mexico. At Shiprock, turn left (east) on US Highway 64 which will take you into Farmington.

For those of us who will be **Dry Camping**, the campsite is located just west of state highway 170. To get there, turn left (north) off US Highway 64 onto state highway 170 as you approach the city limits of Farmington. Continue north on highway 170 for approximately 4.1 miles and then turn left (west) onto a dirt road. Continue for approximately 1 mile, bearing left on the main dirt road to the camping area. Here are the GPS coordinates from Google Maps (36.796213 - 108.236140) for the site. Hopefully, we will have our Club signs posted as you turn off highway 170 directing everyone to the campsite.

For those of you who will NOT be camping, hotel accommodations can be made in either Farmington or Bloomfield.

Please note: The Club will be meeting at the camping area at NO LATER THAN (NLT) 9:00 AM each morning for departure to the collection sites. Please reference the above GPS coordinates for the campsite. On Saturday evening, we will be having a potluck dinner at the campsite, so please bring a dish.

Darrell and Darlene will be the lead for organizing this trip, so <u>please let</u> them know by October 8th if you will be attending. You can call or text them at 801-317-7000 or 7001. Hope to see you in Farmington!
